#### **Airport**

Port Columbus International Airport, located less than 10 miles from The Grand Event Center, is served by 10 airlines and their regional affiliates providing 350 daily arrivals and departures to 35 airports. All ground transportation may be accessed via the terminal walkway or baggage claim level exits.
