Clinical Support Services, Winnipeg School Division, provides a wide range of multi-disciplinary services that help meet the educational, social, emotional and communication needs of students while working collaboratively with schools and families.

Serving an adult newcomer population, the Speech-Language Pathologist will work collaboratively with a team of people from diverse backgrounds and disciplines, including school psychology, school social work, speech language pathology, Community Support Workers, translators, resource teachers, and administration. Experience and knowledge in the areas of newcomers, EAL, universal design, hearing impairments, and community resources would be helpful. The Speech-Language Pathologist will provide services including assessment, programming, and therapeutic interventions and consultative services within a 3-tiered service delivery model.

Qualifications:

- Must be registered, or be eligible for registration, with the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba (CASLPM)
- Must have Master's Degree in Speech-Language Pathology
- Must be eligible for or in possession of current School Clinician Certificate (Speech-Language Pathology)*
- Must be able to work in a collaborative manner with school personnel and families
- Strong technology skills in order to complete all on-line recording and reporting requirements
- Vehicle is required
