

June 2021 Council Meeting Highlights

The College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba protects and serves the public by regulating and ensuring competent, safe, ethical practice of audiologists and speech-language pathologists in Manitoba. At every regular Council meeting, the Registrar and President report on operations of the College and correspondence with local and national regulatory bodies. The financial condition of the College is reviewed and discussed, and all committee chairs provide updates on committee work. Statutory Committees are the Complaints Investigation Committee, the Inquiry Committee, and the Continuing Competency Committee. Standing Committees such as the Practice Advisory Committee and ad hoc committees or working groups (created as needed) also give regular updates.



Decisions Pertaining to Registrants as of June 12, 2021

 Dean Jenkyns was approved as Financial Auditor for the 2021 financial review.



Items of Note to Registrants as of June 12, 2021

- In Camera Special Council Meetings were held March 30 and April 7, 2021 to discuss documentation received about the CETP Exam and concerns regarding CASLPM's CETP Exam Policy. Correspondence about the exam was sent to all registrants on April 14, 2021.
- Although the RHPA grants authority to a college to establish competency requirements for registration including the requirement to write a competency exam, the current CASLPM General Regulation (192/20213) does not stipulate this. Amendments to the General Regulation are recommended by legal Counsel.
- There have been numerous changes in CAASPR (Canadian Alliance of Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Regulators) but CASLPM remains a member
- The financial review as presented and audited by Dean Jenkyns, Accountant, was accepted on April 7, 2021
- An In Camera Special Council Meeting was held on May 13, 2021 to discuss planning for the Annual General Meeting as well as changes to CASLPM staffing and plans for interim hiring
- A new website is in development however it will be some time yet before it is ready to launch.
 An adhoc website committee was created to assist current staff with website development.
- Interviews have been completed for the Acting Registrar position
- The Self-Assessment Tool is ready for testing by Council and Committee members
