

## Council Meeting Highlights September 24, 2022

The College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba protects and serves the public by regulating and ensuring competent, safe, ethical practice of audiologists and speech-language pathologists in Manitoba. At every regular Council meeting, the Registrar and President report on operations of the College and correspondence with local and national regulatory bodies. The financial condition of the College is reviewed and discussed, and all committee chairs provide updates on committee work. Statutory Committees are the Complaints Investigation Committee, the Inquiry Committee, and the Continuing Competency Committee. Standing Committees such as the Practice Advisory Committee and ad hoc committees or working groups (created as needed) also give regular updates.

## Decisions Pertaining to Registrants as of September 24, 2022

 The Continuing Competency Committee will be rolling out a trial review and practice audit process for continuing competency and learning plan early in 2023.

## Items of Note to Registrants as of September 24, 2022

- The CASLPM offices will be moving early in 2023. Information on dates and location will be sent to registrants via email in the new year.
- The Manitoba Speech and Hearing Association archive group has been working to
  ensure important archival documents are preserved. Additionally, the archives contain
  records from individual members of MSHA. These documents are set for destruction on
  December 31, 2022. If you or anyone you know was a member of MSHA and would like
  to retain your MSHA file, you may contact the CASLPM office to arrange for pick-up of
  your items.
- There is a vacancy for an SLP on Council. If you are interested in serving on Council for a three-year term, you may contact the Registrar for more information.
- There are vacancies for non-Council SLP registrants on the Continuing Competency Committee and the Inquiry committee. Registrants can apply to sit on a CASLPM committee at any time during the year.
- Renewals opened in September for all registrants to allow extra time to complete the Jurisprudence Module and online Continuing Competency Tracking.
