Regulatory Matters

1. Complaints Investigation

2022-001: Under review by Complaints Investigation Committee Panel.

There have been no complaints received at the CASLPM office in 2023 to date.

2. National Exam Requirement for Applicants

The Registrar & President met with members of the Legislative Unit on April 28, 2023. Potential wording changes to the General Regulation were vetted by CASLPM Counsel and presented to the Legislative Unit. It was agreed that a requirement for an entry-to-practice exam could move forward to government for changes; however, we were advised that the new wording must include the number of times an applicant/registrant would be allowed to sit at a national exam. The proposed changes will be brought forward for change to the Legislative Unit after Provincial Elections have concluded. Members will have a 60-day period to review and provide comments to the General Regulations once they are prepared by the Legislative Unit.

3. Changes to the Labour Mobility Application Process

The CASLPM Office undertook a review of processes relating to applicants under labour mobility status and determined that CASLPM could not continue to require the 750 hours of work requirement for labour mobility applicants. This was confirmed in April 2023 by the Fair Registration Practices Office (FRPO), who advised us that we must remove the requirement from our documentation and website. The office has complied with the FRPO's requirement to remove the requirement from the practice and is ensuring that all documents are also in compliance.

4. Membership Status of Professionals in Leadership and Administrative Roles

A comprehensive review of the Practice Direction regarding Minimum Practice Hours is being undertaken by the CASLPM office. The anticipated timeline for completion of this review will be determined by Council priorities.
