

Council Meeting Highlights March 18, 2023

The College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba protects and serves the public by regulating and ensuring competent, safe, ethical practice of audiologists and speech-language pathologists in Manitoba. At every regular Council meeting, the Registrar and President report on operations of the College and correspondence with local and national regulatory bodies. The financial condition of the College is reviewed and discussed, and all committee chairs provide updates on committee work. Statutory Committees are the Complaints Investigation Committee, the Inquiry Committee, and the Continuing Competency Committee. Standing Committees such as the Practice Advisory Committee and ad hoc committees or working groups (created as needed) also give regular updates.

Decisions Pertaining to Registrants as of March 18, 2023

<u>Practice Advisory Committee ("PAC") & Advanced Competency Working Group ("ACWG")</u> Updates

- The PAC is working on a Supervision Practice Direction and FAQ.
- Discussion regarding required practice hours for those in leadership roles within the professions are ongoing.
- The Advanced Competency Working Group will review #5: Videofluoroscopic Assessment of Adult Swallowing Disorders Advanced Competency.

Continuing Competency Committee ("CCC") Updates

The office will request volunteer reviewers from among full regulated registrants.

Complaints Investigation Committee ("CIC") Updates

- There is one complaint being reviewed by a panel of the CIC.
- The Complaints Manual is being updated to add office and panel procedural information

Items of Note to Registrants as of March 18, 2023

- CASLPM is proposing changes to General Regulation 192/2013 to the Minister of Health related to the requirement of Provisional applicants to complete a national exam prior to registration in Manitoba. 2023 is an election year and so the timing on approval for these changes may be delayed.
- It was discussed that registrants may wish to obtain liability insurance greater than \$2 million by their own decision and as circumstances dictate.
- CASLPM welcomes Rachel Fang, SLP and Melissa Harju Coutu, Public Representative, to the Continuing Competency Committee.
