## **Required Qualifications:**

- Master's Degree Speech-Language Pathology
- Must be registered with the College of Audiologists and Speech Language Pathologists of Manitoba
- Eligible or in possession of a current Manitoba School Clinician's Certificate
- Valid Class 5 drivers' license and access to a reliable vehicle is required
- This position requires a speech and language clinician who is an active and visible participant within a school environment and can collaborate and communicate effectively on a multi-disciplinary team.

- Proven commitment to Truth and Reconciliation
- Proven ability to build collaborated cultures founded on integrity and collective purpose
