Items of Note to Registrants as of February 28, 2026

Council Application Process

Application packages for Council were distributed on February 27, 2026.

Once Council appointments have been made, registrants will be provided with information about committee vacancies and the application process.

CASLPM Consulting Roles

The CASLPM Council has agreed to the hiring of audiology and speech-language pathology consultants from among registrants to assist with a variety of items including requests for information, competency reviews, complaints, etc. These roles will be filled with a view towards diversity of experience. More information will follow the completion of Council appointments.

Council By-law Review Schedule

Council has been reviewing and adjusting by-laws quarterly for the past several years. With significant changes to the CASLPM by-laws being completed, by-laws will now be reviewed by Council on an annual basis.

Policy Revisions

Policy CP04 Conflict of Interest has been slightly revised.

NEW Policy RD13 Registrant Private Practice List has been approved by Council.
