

Introduction

This *Reserved Acts Standard of Practice* outlines the expectations for registrants while performing Reserved Acts as part of their professional practice.

Standard

Registrants of the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba (CASLPM) perform only reserved acts that they are authorized and competent to perform in compliance with governing legislation.

Demonstrating the Standard

Registrants will:

- Be familiar with the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba *reserved acts for the practice of speech-language pathology* and *reserved acts for the practice of audiology*, including procedures or episodes of care that involve reserved acts, under *The Regulated Health Professions Act* and *Practice of Audiology and Practice of Speech-Language Pathology Regulation 191/2013*.
- Perform only reserved acts that they are competent to perform and that are appropriate to the scope of practice and the procedure being performed.
- Assess the risks and benefits associated with the reserved act and
 - communicate them to clients.
 - adjust service plans accordingly to mitigate risks and enhance benefits.
- Self-monitor application of reserved acts and be accountable for actions and decision making.
- Ensure that appropriate strategies are in place to address any critical or unexpected occurrences associated with the application of reserved acts.
